The first railroad passenger train in America was run on the 27th of September, 1825, between Albany and Buffalo, N. Y. The train consisted of two coaches and fifteen passengers, as follows (commencing at the rear of the train):

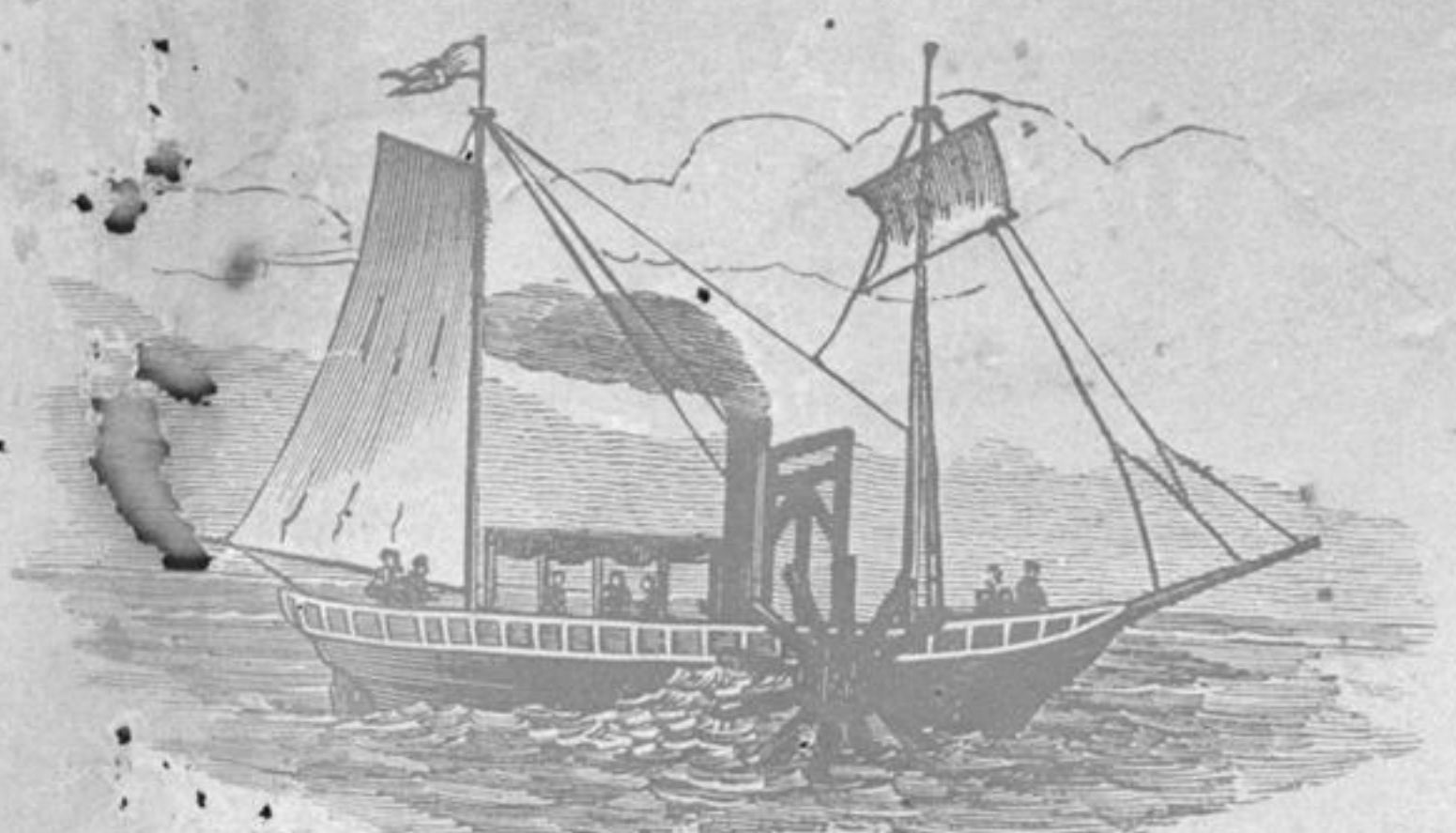

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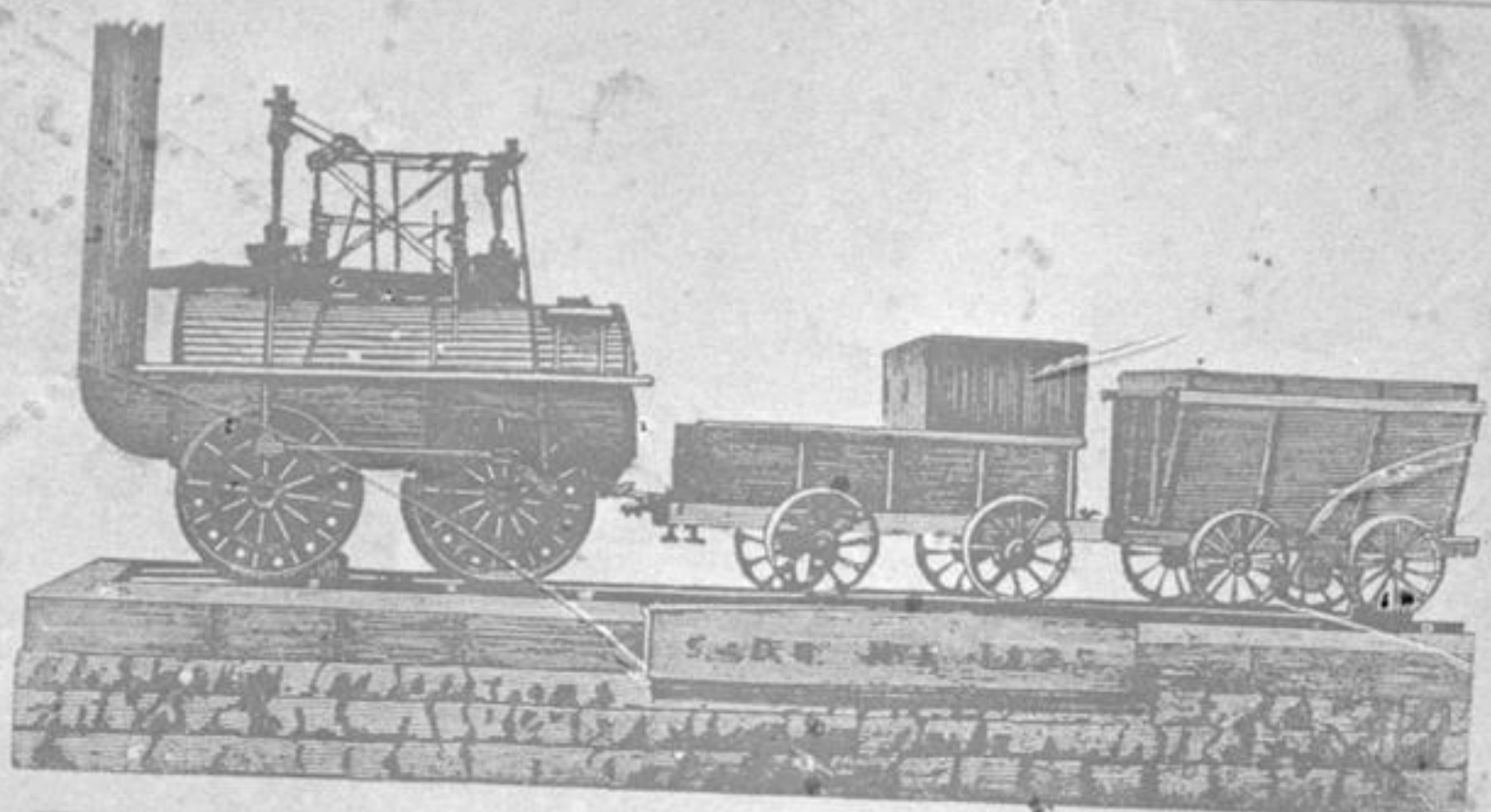

The first steam locomotive in the world was built by Richard Trevithick in 1804. It was used to haul iron castings from the Penydarren ironworks to the Swansea docks in South Wales.



ROBERT FULTON'S STEAMBOAT "CLERMONT"

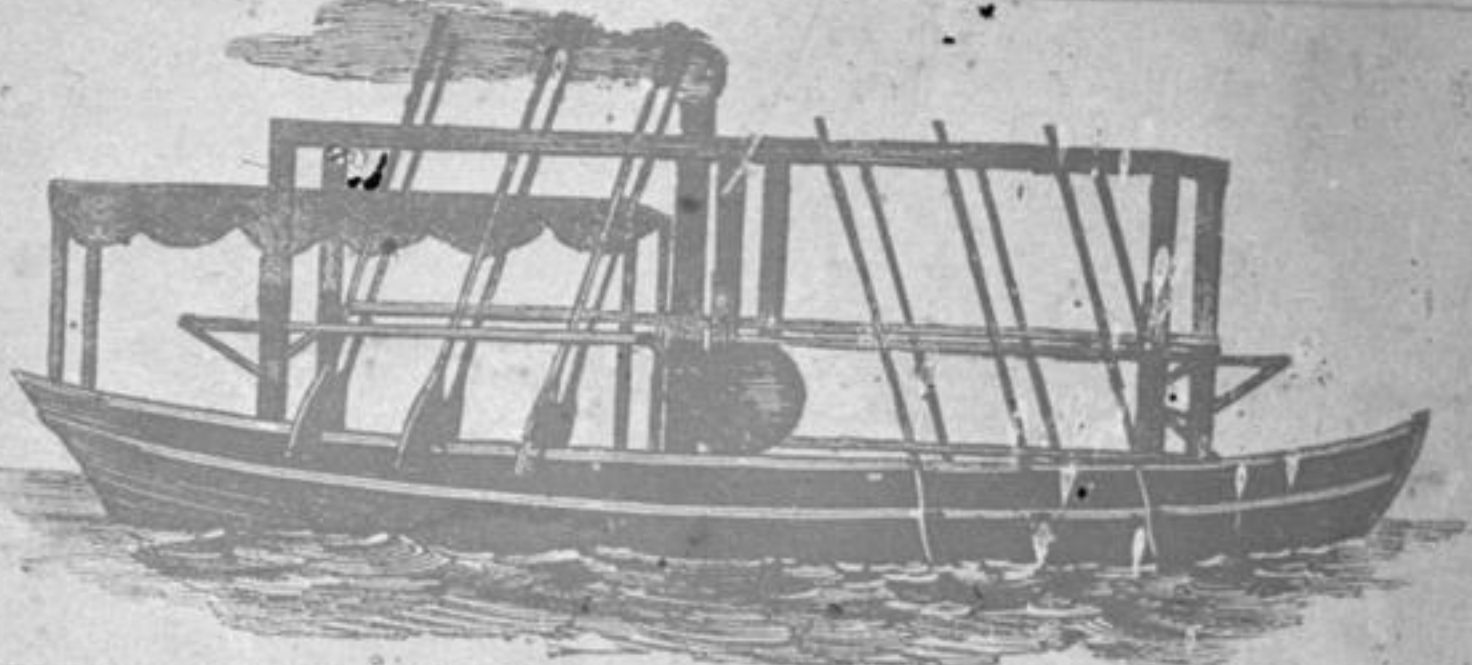
The first successful steamboat in America, or in the world, the "Clermont," was built by Robert Fulton and Nicholas Trigg. She was launched in New York on August 30, 1807, and made her first voyage to Albany on September 15, 1807.

THE FIRST STEAMBOAT IN THE WORLD

The first application of steam to navigation, that showed any evidence of success, was made in 1807, by Robert Fulton. His steamboat, the "Clermont," was the first to make a regular voyage between New York and Albany.
