New password regulations are a small facet of UK's online campus management, the student information system that went live this Pebruary, and includes students' e-mail; billing and personal information, and class registration capabilities.

SG retools freshman leadership program

Student Government has renamed and revamped its freshman program in hopes of making it more effective at developing new students into campus leaders.

The Leadership Development Program, previously called the Freshman Representative Council, will focus more on leadership skills and involvement, a change SG Vice President Brittany Langdon said will help make the program more worthwhile.

"I didn't think the name FRC really summed up what it was," Langdon said, "lis not really a representative council, but about leaders on campus. We vanted to change the program as a whole."

Langdon said she looked at other universities' freshman organizations and talked with students who had been in the FRC for ideas on how to improve the program.

"Last year, people didn't think it was all that it could be," Langdon said. "It was pretty ineffective."

infective. Teshmen involved in the retooled program will volunteer in community service projects, participate in a mentoring system, and hear guest speakers from student organizations and the UK administration.

Campus involvement is a key part of adjusting to college life, Lengdon said, and the need for the reorganized freshman program was clear to her.

The first of five endowed chairs established by the Center for Research on Violence Against Women has been hired and will join UK tomor-

Ann. L. Coker was named the Verizon Wireless Endowed Chair of Studies on Violence Against Women after a nationwide search and will focus no women's health.

Brooks said, "it's going to be a reallyfun year in Kentucky football."



UK vs. EKU: Position by Position

Quarterbacks



Running Backs



EKU has an exciting 1-2-3 punch at the running back position. Seniors Mark Dunn and Bobby Washington combined for more than 1300 yards fast year and sophomore C.J. Walker is expected to get more carries this year. The Cats might have lacked a 1-2-3 combination last year with the injures to senior Rafael Little and junior Tony Dixon, but in the process, they opened the door for sophomore Alfonson Smith to get carries, adding to the Cats' potent ground attack.

Receivers



Seniors Kyle Barber and Quinton Williams are the only returning receivers who saw significant playing time at the wide out position for EKU last year. The departure of All-American Patrick Bugg leaves the Colonels extremely thin at receiver. The Cast were fortunate when All-Southeastern Conference receiver Keenan Burton opted to return for his senior season instead of jumping to the NFL. Burton, All-SEC senior tight end Jacob Tamme and junior wide out Dicky, Lyons, Jr. give the Cats one of the most dangerous receiving trios in the SEC.

Offensive Line



The Colonels have experience. The Cats don't. If there is any area that UK might be lacking this year on offense, it's the on the line. The Cats lost three starters to graduation, but fifth-year bead coach Rich Brooks still thinks it might be his most athletic offensive line he has ever had at UK. The Colonels return four of their five starters from last year but will have a tough time facing an SEC defense.

Don't expect a Cats letdown even with all the talk and hype surrounding this season. The Cats are too hungry to get the season underway and too talent-ed to have any problem with the Colonels. UK's offense should put up plenty of numbers tomorrow, but look for the Cats' defense to be the answer in this one. After back-to-back disappointing seasons on the defensive side of the ball, the Cats return an experienced defensive unit and should have any easy time controlling Greco and company.

The numbers are simple. Eastern Kentucky University quarterback Josh Greco threw more interceptions (13) than touchdowns (10) last year. Meeting the company of the company

Defensive Backs

One of the more intriguing match-ups of the day will be Colonel cornerback Derrick Huff against Burton. Huff led the Ohio Valley Conference last year with 11 pass break-ups and will have help over the top from All-OVC safety Brandon Gathoft. UK sophomore cornerback Trevard Lindley is an up-and-coming star in the SEC. With the big-play ability of junior free safety Marcus McClinton (team-high four interceptions and five forced fumbles) and senior strong safety Roger Williams (two interceptions and three fumble recoveries), the Cats should give the EKU passing game headaches all day.

Special Teams

Tomorrow's clash will feature explosive return games from both teams. Colonel wide receiver Davin Walker returned a kick 100 yards for a touch-down against Murray State last year, and defensive back Garnett Phelps averaged a decent 12-4 yards per return on punts. UR's return game is just as explosive, as it led the nation last year in punt returns with a 204 yards per return and placed 10th in the nation in kickoff returns with a 24-yard average. Little will return the majority of the punts while Burton and Lyons will share kickoff return duties.

Defensive Line

EKU's defensive line is big, but inexperienced. Colonel defensive end Cardius Dowell leads the line with 8.5 career sacks — 2.5 more sacks than the other three projected starters combined. Junior defensive tackle Myron Pryor's one-game suspension for violating team rules makes the Cats dangerously thin at defensive tackle. If sophomore defensive end Jeremy Jarmon continues to build on last year's late-season surge, the Cats will have a legitimate pass-rushing threat on the outside.



Bush says Gulf Coast recovering, but signs of neglect abound

NEW ORLEANS — President Bush marked the second anniversary of Hurricane Katrians's devastating cut through the Gulf Coast region on Wednesday, proclaiming that "better days are ahead" for New Orleans and promising that his administration is still engaged in recovery efforts.

Bush and his wife, Laura, observed a moment of silence at 9:38 a.m. — the moment the levees broke here — at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Chater School for Science and Technology, the first school to reopen in the city's heavily damaged Low-

er Ninth Ward.

Afterward, the president described New Orleans as rebounding after the 2005 Category 3 hurricane that killed 1,695 people, displaced 770,090 to acaused at least \$96 billion in damage to homes, businessed and government property in the Gulf Coast.

"My attitude is this: New Orleans, better days are ahead," Bush told a group of education officials, students and community lead the organized properties to see progress when you live in a community all the imine. Hiring 200 new faculty members for this school year will certainly help UK advance toward top-20 status, but if the turnover rate isn't improved, it might take a while to get there.

While the total number of faculty hired is impressive, the actual gain is considerably less. When last year's resignations and retirements are considered, the nef faculty increase is only 60, according to statistics officially released by the university yesterday.
