

Edmund Randolph, Esquire, Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, To All To Whom these Presents shall come, Greetings: Know Ye, that by Notice and in consideration of a Land-Office Treasury warrant, Number fourteen thousand three hundred and eighty eight, issued the twenty fourth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and eighty two, there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Robert Todd, assignee of Christopher Greenup, a certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing Two hundred acres by survey, bearing date the twenty third day of May, one thousand seven hundred and eighty five, lying and being in the county of Fayette, on the waters of Hickmans Creek, and bounded as follows: To wit - beginning at an ash, Hoopwood and Hickory corner to Thomas Poag's pre-emption, running thence with his line and the course thereof south seventeen degrees, west three hundred and eighty poles to two buckeyes, corner to John Todd's pre-emption, thence south seventy three degrees, East eighty two poles to two Spanish oaks on the South West side of Turner's ruin, corner of Waller Overton's pre-emption thence with the line of said pre-emption North eighteen degrees East three hundred and sixty four poles to three elms and a hoopash in the line of a survey of seven hundred and seventy

acres made for the said Robert Todd, thence with said line North, Survey three degrees West eighty six poles to the beginning, - with its Appurtenances; to HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or Parcel of Land with its Appurtenances, to the said Robert Todd and his Heirs for ever. IN WITNESS whereof, the said, Edmund Randolph Esquire, Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, hath hereunto set his Hand, and caused the lesser seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond, on the twentieth day of August in the Year of Our Lord, One thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Eight and of the Commonwealth, the Thirteenth.
