1. Change chemistry 15a, b to 115a, b; 17 to 117; 18 to 118; 19a, b to 119a, b; 22a, b to 122a, b; 23 to 123; 29 to 129; 30a, b to 130a, b.
2. In Industrial Chemistry course
2nd semester freshman year--drop chem. 3; add draw, 2b, 1.3 crs.
1st semester sophomore year--drop drawing 2b.

- 1st semester senior year--drop chemistry 5a.
 2nd semester senior year--drop chemistry 5b; physics 110; add chemistry 150, 4 credits.
3. English 126 (Library Methods for Teachers) 3 credits.
 This course is an enlargement of the old English 26, which counted 2 credits.

Application of Phi Beta Chi for recognition as a local pre-medic Fraternity was laid on the table pending the report of the Committee on Honorary and Professional Fraternities.
