

② Harlan Wallis Coal Corp, cited viol, wages & hours,  
R. N. M & Donough, laid off by H.W. in December with others + never paid  
overtime & that fired because talked in favor of UMW & being paid  
Waked from 5 P.M. to 6:30 am, drew \$4.16 day after code went into effect.  
Bones - "Did you keep record of overtime so that if Harlan Co. came into  
you might get this back pay" - Reply kept it 4 mos. H.W. have no  
checkbook & when notices posted for election the notices were torn  
Waked six days & sometimes seven. Had 3 mine guards now sent last  
summer at one time had 147 with machine guns, in response to question  
from Pittman if 3 dep. could prevent 500 employees from forming union.  
Disseminated 13 men who wanted union.

M. A. Musick, rep. UMW, arrested last April in Va., said, did after  
release & his - started to meet in Va., stopped on road by men  
with machine guns. Later, in May, stopped enroute to another meeting  
knocked men down, had sub. mach. gun, said deputies struck him  
& kicked him across 2 r.r. tracks by near Middleton. Said John  
Smith, negro, was whipped & taken out of Harlan, negro told later,  
Musick said, <sup>see</sup> ~~see~~ & <sup>Frank</sup> white, deputies did beating & said  
Middleton told Musick he could get no "protection" since  
he got into this org. racket" + Middleton <sup>off</sup> ~~off~~ <sup>with</sup> ~~with~~ <sup>opposed</sup>  
to unionization of fields.

Geo. M. Burchett - UMW - org, arrest charge possession <sup>magazine</sup> & fined \$50. Later  
jailed for carrying pistol, then jailed on peace bond; later jailed on pistol  
charge. Said all arrests were false, said had to hide with Geo. Bates  
under blankets in Sach's store prior to meeting of UMW scheduled, said  
withak drew gun & followed in from courthouse.
