 town be withdrawn to withdraw to the end of the session.
 Said that he be publicly reprimanded in Chapel. Second.
 Carried. - On request of Col. Clark he was authorized to
 inflict punishment in minor cases of breach of discipline
 without calling the Board of Discipline together.
