The faculty met in the President's room in the College building at 4 pm

Present: President Patterson, Prof White, Prof Neville, Puce, Pryor, W.H. Patterson, Anderson Mathews, Miller, Brooks, and McKenzie.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved

On motion of Prof. Miller, ordered that the Executive Committee be requested to authorize the faculty to offer a gold medal (worth say \$5.00) to the best prepared student who competes in Trigonometry in the "Blue Grass" Tournament; also a gold medal (worth say \$5.00) to the best prepared student who competes in the Classics.— Provided that solutions and translations be expressed in creditable English.

On motion ordered that the Executive Committee be authorized the faculty to offer a scholarship to the student who takes most prizes in the Blue Grass Tournament, (provided that not more than one of the prizes shall be taken for excellence in Athletics).

Prof. White Chairman of the Committee appointed on March 9th to consider and report upon the petition of L.A. Darling and others, relative to a Chapter of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity, submitted a verbal report of the Committee recommending that the chapter be established and that list of names be approved.

On motion the report of the Committee was approved, it being provided the B.F. Thompson shall not become a member until he is clear of restrictions in the Academy.



A committee composed of the Deans of the several Courses of Study was appointed to determine the class honors for the current year.

Prof. Anderson moved, second by Dr. Byer, that the teaching force be divided into three classes;

Professors, Assistants and Instructors, and that the members of the last two classes be determined by the President of the College.

On motion of Prof. Matthews the ~~motion~~ foregoing was reconsidered.

On motion of Prof. Neville, ordered that the names of the assistants be published in the Catalogue for the current year in the order in which they appeared in the preceding catalogue, except that the name of Mr. DeBaw shall be placed below that of Mr. J. D. Fair.

On motion of Prof. Anderson ordered that the Catalogue for the current year be of the same general character and printed in the same kind of type as the Catalogue of the preceding year.
