MINUTES OF THE SENATE DECEMBER 12, 1921

The Senate met Monday, December 12, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of November 14 and special meeting of November 29, also Council minutes of November 11, 18, 25 and December 2 were read and approved.

The following names were presented as candidates for advanced degrees and recommended to the Board of Trustees for the degrees indicated:

The following recommendations of the Rules Committee were adopted:

1. That no student be admitted to regular classes of the University later than four weeks after the registration period, except by consent of the Council.
2. That the title "Student Loan Fund" without any qualifying term shall refer only to the fund administered by the University Senate Student Loan Fund Committee.
3. That any individual, group or organization connected in any way with the University shall first obtain permission from the University Senate Student Loan Fund Committee before advertising for the benefit of or soliciting funds for the "Student Loan Fund."

The Senate approved the following report of the committee appointed to investigate the proposition that all research work be placed under the supervision of the Smithsonian Institute:
