## Gates selected as CIA leader

Official who urged disclosure of arms sales to replace Casey

WASHINGTON — Robert Gates, a
CIA official who reportedly urged
disclosure of secret arms sales to
Iran before they were revealed, was
picked by President Reagan yesterday to replace the ailing William J.
Casey as director of the spy agency.
The 73-year-old Casey, recuperaling from surgery seven weeks ago
for a brain tumor, was invited to become a counselor to the president
when and if he can return to work.
Gates, 43, has been the No. 2 official at the CIA since April 1986 and
has been running the agency in Casey's absence.





faculty members. Too many times, students carrying a full class load have not had the time to adequately prepare for their fi-

This is particularly true for students who are required

This is particularly true for students who are required to research and write term papers that are seemingly always due just before final exams begin.


The scenario is compounded when students are required to attend class lectures right up until finals week begins.

As a result, students who have finals on Monday have little more than 48 hours — not counting time for sleeping — to cram for tests that are designed to determine what they have learned during the entire semester.

This is where the contradiction occurs.

The way tests are administered now, they do not measure what students have learned; they only measure what students have memorized.

Just ask the more than 1,000 students who studied for last semester's finals at the Cramarama, which was organized by SGA. Although it is probable that most of those students passed their tests — some with "Bs" and "As"— it is also just as probable that much of what they "learned" to pass their finals has already been forgotten.

BEIRUT, Lebanon - Pro-Iranian kidnappers said yes-




