Library financing plan progressing

Officials reviewing options for bond sale

By Stephen Trimble

Prospects for finding a financing plan to pay for UK's expensive new library are slowing taking shape, a University official said Friday.

Unable to find a proper way to finance a \$41 million bond issue, University officials asked the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council on Wednesday to postpone a final vote on the funding project for two weeks.

The council was set to approve the second reading of the proposal for UK's Central and Life Sciences Library on Thursday but took the item off the meeting's docket at the University officials' request. UK Vice President for Administration George DeBin said his staff still is reviewing several financing options for the bond sale, which he expects to

settle by the council's next regular meeting on Nov.

17.

"It's taking a little longer, but it's looking more and more attractive." DeBin said, adding the delay won't affect the library's construction timetable, which is projected to begin early next month. The city council will then issue the bonds to the UK Alumni Association, who will eventually give the library to the University.

"When you have a plan like this with this many variables, ... it takes a while for everyone to get on the same page," DeBin said.

The delay fits tightly into a window UK officials had expected, DeBin said, for the council's final approval.

The window extends until the last week of November, allowing the bonds can be issued by the first week of December, DeBin said.

DeBin flatly denied any speculation that the delay was caused by comments made at a public hearing on Tuesday that was sponsored by the council. Lexington resident Don Pratt told council members at the hearing they were being "railroaded" into making a decision without hearing all of the options. Former geologist Edward Wilson also voiced his criticism of the proposed library site, which lies between two sinkholes on Clifton Avenue. Collapsed caves beneath the ground caused the sink holes, he said, making the site potentially dangerous for large buildings.

"The decision (to delay the council's vote) had nothing to do with that meeting," DeBin said. As soon as the bonds can be issued by the city council. UK can begin construction work on the \$58 million project. Library donors already have given more than \$21 zil million for construction and a book endowment.

The city council is required by law to review the bond issue, and a meeting between council members and UK's bond counsel, Spencer Harper, has been scheduled for Friday morning, said Councilman Willie Fogle.

NATION Clinton on stump for final campaign push

WASHINGTON — With control of Congress and key statehouses in the blance, President Clinton hunted West Coast votes for Democrats yesterday in a final, uphill campaign push. Republicans expressed confidence they would capture control of the Senate, and perhaps the House, as well.

"I'll be happy with a one-vote victory," said Texas GOP gubernatorial challenger George W. Bush, speaking for nervous candidates everywhere.

With voters expressing widespread anger and distillusionment, the polls all pointed to major, midterm Republican congressional gains.

"Obviously, we're going to lose some seats in the House and in the Senate," ocnceded White House Chief of Staff Leon Panetta. Even so, he said on CBS' Sunday Morning, "we have a very good chance" of holding both houses for the final two years of Clinton's turn.

In the House, where Democrats have held a majority for 40 years, GOP Whip Newt Gingrich predicted Republican gains of 35 to 60 seats. A switch of 40 would make him speaker, the first Republican to wield the gavel since Dwight Eisenhower was president.

Vanderbilt deals Cats eighth-straight loss

Vanderbilt continued its dominance over the UK football program Saturday afternoon, soundly defeating the Wildcats 24-6 at Commonwealth Stadium.

The game was marred by five UK turnovers, which led directly to two Vandy touchdowns and allowed the Commodores (5-4, 2-4 SEC) to waltz out of Lexington with their fourth consecutive victory over the hapless Wildcats.

"In a game like this, you can invariably glance at one stat and be able to tell who won — the



Muslims, Jews protest tomb security

HEBRON, West Bank — Both Muslims and Jews protested new Israeli security measures today at the Tomb of the Patriarchs, which is to reopen 8 1/2 months after a lewish settler machine-gunned 29 Muslims while they knet in prayer.

The measures require Muslims and Jews pray separately. They also would have separate bathrooms and walkways outside the shrine, which has been equipped with metal detectors, electronic gates and television cameras.

detectors, electronic gates and television cameras. Yasser Arafat, head of the Palestinian self-rule authority, issued a statement saying that restructuring the building violated the Israeli-PLO peace treaty.

"We consider the Ibrahimi Mosque a holy place for Muslims, and we do not accept division or separation," he said. "We see this separation as a provocation that will lead to increasing tension between Muslims and Jews."

increasing tension between Muslims and Jew. It is not a house of worship anymore. It's a house of politics," said Abdel Rauf al-Muthassib, who lives across the street Strate's Cabinet vored unanimously Sunday to test the new security measures by opening the tomb for a few days this week, starting this morning. Both sides will be limited to 200 worshipers. If things go well, the tomb will remain open after Nov. 15 and the numbers will increase.

The new measures bar Jews from entering the largest room inside the building. Yitzhak Hall, which is used as a mosque. The immediate area around the tombs of Abraham and Jacob will be reserved for Jews. Both sides view Abraham as a founding prophet of their faith and thus want to worship around his tomb and those of all his family members. Each faith will have only one entrance from the outside, with other doors, as well as interior portals, sealed with huge iron sheets. Each side will have exclusive use of the building during 10 religious holidays during the year.

Both Jews and Muslims said the new mea-

"The restrictions prevent Muslims-from praying freely in the mosque. We refuse this partition, and we consider it against our religion," he said, noting Muslims had known the structure as the Ibrahim Mosque for 1,300 years.

Islamic fundamentalist groups called for a boycott of the prayers, scheduled to start before dawn today. Hebron leaders asked Arafat to discuss his asking Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin to delay the opening.

Jews were equally unhappy.
"This is total discrimination against Jews and totally ignores the rights of Jews in this historic place," said Noam Arnon, spokesman for the 450 Jewish settlers living among Hebron's 80,000 Palestinians.

Only the specially trained 100-member security force will be allowed inside the tomb with weapons. Soldiers in the guard unit speak Arabic and many are Druse Arabs.

Jewish settlers will have to leave their weapons at the door, passing through two metal detectors on the way in.
"We don't have any reason to have weapons inside if there is enough protection," Arnon said.

Military officials said some settlers would be barred completely but would not say how many.

The plans emerged from a 338-page report compiled by a commission headed by Meir Shamgar, the chief justice of Israel's Supreme Court.

The town is still volatile months after the deadly assault. Palestinians complain that life has never returned to normal since the massacre, with added checkpoints and the central vegetable market closed.

Anti-gay sentiments being fanned by murdered Israeli professor's case

TEL AVIV, Israel —
Yeshayahu Demner was a respected engineering professor
described by students as a
reserved, kindly man.

Now police suspect the 46year-old bachelor led a double life,
dedicating the last year of his life
to spreading the AIDS virus until
he was murdered last week.
Demner's case has stunned
Israel. Gay activists fear their
struggle for acceptance in a conservative society has been set back
years. Some lawmakers are pressing for a crackdown against people
with Acquired Immune Deficiency
Syndrome.

The story broke when police,
alerted by colleagues that Demner
was missing for two days, burst
into his Haifa apartment Monday
to discover his naked body on the
couch with marks on his head
where he had been struck.

Police said meticulous personal
records found in the apartment
revealed a dual identity.

David Tuval, the detective in
charge of the case, said the docu-

ments showed Demner discovered he had HIV, the sexually transmit-table virus that leads to AIDS, in the fall of 1993. After that, he had sex "with many dozens of men" on condition that no protection be used, Tuval said.

Police sources said the murderer might be a sex partner who discovered Demner was HIV-positive. They refuse to say if they
have any suspects.

Another man was found murdered in Pardes Katz, near Tel
Aviv, on Sunday, and police were
investigating possible links to the

Tuval said police don't know Demner's motives. But tabloids have constructed a grisly portrait of a man determined to take as many people with him as he could. A special report in the mass circulation Maariv daily featured a full-page picture of a smiling, side-burned Demmer and a caption that referred to "his amazing campaign of vengeance."

Other reports described him as a "male prostitute" who sometimes was paid for sex and on other occasions offered partners money to forego condoms.

Regardless of what Demner may have done or why, the case is bound to buttress strong anti-gay feelings in Israel, said Anula Shamir, spokeswoman for the Society For Personal Rights, which promotes gay issues.

While Israel was founded on liberal Western values, about half its present population originates in Middle Eastern societies where homosexuality is not accepted.

Orthodox Judaism, which prizes procreation and holds sway in issues like marriage and divorce in Israel, is another anti-gay influence, Shamir said.
"The Demner case has done gays and lesbians here great harm, strengthening a stereotype of the homosexual as dangerous to society, a corrupter of young people," she said.
"Gays and lesbians are far more afraid than in other Western societies to come out of the closet and claim even those ights that they have on paper."

Gunshot kills church leader who condemned apartheid

PRETORIA, South Africa— The killing of a white church lead-er branded a traitor to his race because he condemned apartheid raised fears Sunday that political violence would again flare in South Africa.

Police refused to speculate on why Johan Heyns, former head of the Dutch Reformed Church, was killed last night by a single shot to the head.

But others were convinced Heyns was killed by extremists who opposed the direction in which he had taken his church. President Nelson Mandela mourned Heyns yesterday morn-ing as a "soldier of peace."

"His untimely death is a loss to the South African nation as a whole, black and white," Mandela

said.
The 66-year-old Heyns, head of the church from 1986 to 1990, had been a controversial figure for his anti-apartheid stances.
His Dutch Reformed Church is the church of most Afrikaners, the descendants of Dutch settlers, and until the 1980s gave theological justification for the Afrikaner-led state's policies of racial discrimination.

"Everything points to the fact that it was a political assassination," said Beyers Naude, a prominent theologian who was defrocked by the Dutch Reformed Church in 1963 for his outspoken opposition to apartheid.

Naude was welcomed back into the church only this year.

Heyns died instantly when an unknown attacker using a large-caliber rifle shot him through a window of his home in a

bougainvillea-shaded neighborhood of Pretoria. He was hit in the back of the head.

Heyns had been playing cards with his wife and grandehildren, police said. The gunshot came from about six yards away. No one cless was injured.

"It was well-planned and it was professionally done.

"The person must have known exactly where to go and how to do it," Naude said.

Gen. Constand Viljoen, head of the white rightist Freedom Front party, said the "assassination underlined that violence and anarchy are still present just below the surface of South African society."

"Real reconciliation has still not taken place," Viljoen said. "We must all work on this."

Viljoen has himself been called a traitor by more extreme rightwingers who believe they should fight for a white homeland. Viljoen favors negotiations with the black-led government. Heyns stepped down as head of the church in 1990, prevented from serving another term by church rules. Heyns studied in Europe after he completed college in South Africa, and later said his experience abroad had a profound influence.

"Whereas I had grown up with blacks who were always culturally, socially and academically beneath me, in Europe I met blacks who were on a similar level," he once said, according to the South African Press Association.
"I realized that the color black need not be a symbol of inferiority."

Issue dominant in races

A group pushing for changes in Kentucky's school-reform law hopes to gain legislative supporters after elections this week in districts where education has been adominant and divisive issue.

The Family Foundation, a conservative Lexington-based group critical of the reform law, compiled a list of the legislative races where the 4-year-old Kentucky Education Reform Act has been a leading issue.

Martin Cothran, a policy analyst with the group, cited 18 campaigns in which pro-KERA and anti-KERA candidates are sharply divided. His list also includes \$2

candidates who strongly support changing the reforms.

"With a few exceptions, candidates on both sides agree that KERA needs to undergo surgery," Cothran said. "The issue seems to be, should the surgery be major or minor?"

Cothran's group joined forces with other KERA critics behind a campaign called CARE, which stands for the Campaign for Academic Renewal in Education. The group is pushing a legislative platform to dramatically change pieces of school reform during the 1996 General Assembly.

House Speaker Joe Clarke said legislative leaders also are watching races across the state to see

how candidates stand on KERA and other issues. He said he thinks a number of newcomers who support the reform will win.

Clarke, D-Danville, said he is confident that there will be enough support to keep the reform intact after tomorrow's elections.

Rep. Kenny Rapier, D-Bardstown, thinks proponents of reform might even pick up two seats. "If it comes out that way, it will be a confirmation of KERA," Rapier said.

One of the most important races for critics is the 24th Senate District campaign in northern Kentucky.





Worshippers pray for Reagan

Well-wishers send messages to ex-president

LOS ANGELES — Worshippers at former President Reagan's
church bowed their heads yesterday to pray for a "healing hand" to
fight his Alzheimer's disease, while
messages wishing him well poured
in from around the country.

"We are concerned and
shocked to hear of his illness," the
Rev. Paul Pierson said in leading
parishioners at Bel Air Presbyterian Church.

One day after Reagan's disclosure that he had been diagnosed
with the incurable brain disease,
the pastor prised him for making
his condition public.
"It may help others seek help,"
Pierson said.
"We pray for your healing hand

Pierson said.
"We pray for your healing hand to slow the progress of this dis-

ease," he said in leading the prayer.
Reagan's handwritten letter disclosing the disease was accompanied by a statement from five doctors.
"They said that while Reagan's health was otherwise good, "it is expected that as the years go on it will begin to deteriorate."
Reagan, 83, and his wife, Nancy, didn't attend yesterday's services at their 2,000-member church overlooking the San Fernando Valley.
They also were not at their Barries tate, where TV cameras were set up outside the gate.
Reagan spokeswoman Cathy Busch said the Reagans were out of town and she wouldn't disclose where.
Telephone lines to the Reagan offices were jammed and the staff left after a short time yesterday because they were unable to handle the volume.

"It's unbelievable. The calls and faxes are flooding in. There's too many to count. The outpouring is incredible," Busch said.

At the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley, northwest of Los Angeles, visitors trickled into the museum.
"It's sad, very sad," said library docent Michael Markese.
The letter, in which the former president said he would stay active and enjoy life, was vintage Reagan, he said.
"He's alwaws home get." and enjoy inc, he said. "He's always been such an opti-

Between Sunday's two morning

Apple, IBM team up for new PC

NEW YORK — For more than a decade, the first thing peo-ple considered when they bought a personal computer was whether it would be an Apple or IBM-com-patible.

15 'relief pitchers' likely to play key roles in O.J. Simpson trial

LOS ANGELES — The judge calls them relief pitchers. Others see them as co-pilots or understudies, poised for their moment. Whatever the label, at least some of the alternate jurors yet to be picked for O.J. Simpson's murder trial are likely to play a key role.

"I can guarantee you that the 12 jurors who have been selected will not be the 12 who render a verdict in this case," District Attorney Gil Garcetti predicted.

In a trial expected to last at least six months, jurors may fall ill, encounter personal emergencies that will force them to drop out, or somehow disobey the judge's admonition to avoid all media coverage of the case. If that happens, an alternate juror will step in.

To ward against a mistrial, Judge Lance Ito wants 15 alter-

In the Reginald Denny beating trial, five of six alternates were pressed into service.

Alternate jurors sit in court and listen to all the testimony but don't participate in deliberations unless they replace a regular juror.

Lawyers in the Simpson case are to begin selecting alternate jurors tomorrow, drawing on a pool of 80 prospects who filled out questionnaires in September but have not yet been quizzed in person.

The new round of inquiry could be just as intense as the sixweek process that ended Thursday with the swearing in of 12 jurors to decide if Simpson killed ex-wife Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend Ronald Goldman.

"I think both sides are going to approach selection with only slightly diminished zeal," said Robert Pugsley, a law professor at

Southwestern University.

"The alternates are very important in a case like this because there's a high likelihood they will have to use them," said Loyola University law professor Laurie

have to use them, 'said Loyola University law professor Laurie Levenson. "In addition to the usual problems of illness or emergencies, there is a good chance they may be tainted by publicity before the trial is over."

Ito has added a complication by delaying a crucial hearing until after jurors and alternates are selected.

All will be sent home and told to avoid news coverage while lawyers spend perhaps the entire month of December wrangling over the admissibility of the prosecution's DNA evidence.

During that month, there's a chance one of the 12 could be exposed to reports on the evidence.


