President McVey announced the program for Commencement week; he also announced the next convocation June 16, at which time an honorary degree is to be conferred upon Sir Leslie McKenzie.

The following recommendations of the Committee upon duplication of courses were approved:

↓ Mathematics 120. Mathematical Statistics. Three credits.

↓ Combine Metallurgy 201. Heat Treatment of Steel, and Metallurgy 202, Heat Treatment of Steel Laboratory, into Metallurgy 205, Heat Treatment of Metals and Alloys. Six credits.

↓ Combine Metallurgy 203, Oil Shale Technology, and Metallurgy 204, Oil Shale Technology Laboratory into Metallurgy 206, Oil Shale Technology. Lectures and Recitations three hours a week; Laboratory twelve hours a week, for one semester. Nine credits.

The prerequisites, course content and credit are exactly as given for Metallurgy 203 and 204, the only change being in the combination of the two courses into one. Professor Crouse.

↓ Metallurgy 207. Technology of Alloys. Lectures and Recitations two hours a week; laboratory eight hours a week for one semester. Six credits.

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE OCTOBER 8, 1928

The University Senate met in Room 303 of White Hall, Monday, October 8, with President McVey in the chair.

The minutes of May 25 were approved as read.

Professors Roberts and Webb were reelected Senate representatives on the University Council for 1928-29.

The following recommendations of the Committee on Duplication of Courses were approved:

↓ Psychology 102a, Genetic Psychology. Three hours a week. Three credits, first semester.

↓ Psychology 102b, Genetic Psychology. Two hours lecture and two hours laboratory a week. Three credits. Second semester.

Note: Psych. 102a, b are old courses revived.

↓ Psychology 190a,b. Seminar in Psychology. One two-hour discussion a week. One credit per semester.
